FFC Scholarship Award Program

ENTERS ITS 20th YEAR!

Since its inception in 1999, the FFC scholarship award program has distributed 62 scholarships totaling \$124,000. The program annually awards post-secondary education scholarships (college or vocational/technical school) to promising students born with a facial difference. High school graduates or students currently attending college who are residents of New England (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont) are eligible to apply. The Foundation selects award recipients based on their academic performance, extracurricular activities, and community service.

At our Annual scholarship awards presentation, it is an honor and privilege for those in attendance to learn of the accomplishments of these promising students. FFC is proud to be able to play a small role in helping their dreams to come true as they move through their college experiences. Many of our scholarship recipients return to FFC as volunteers — helping at events, offering support to younger generations and establishing themselves as mentors and role models.





BCH Welcomes Ingrid Ganske, MD, to the Team!

Dr. Ingrid Ganske joined the cleft and craniofacial team at Boston Children's Hospital (BCH) as an attending physician in 2016. She comes to the field of plastic surgery from a background in design, having studied architecture at Princeton University and worked in an architecture firm in New York City before deciding to pursue a medical career. She now focuses on architectural reconstructions in the head and neck, such as cleft lip/palate, cleft rhinoplasty, and ear anomalies.

Dr. Ganske completed her training in the Harvard Plastic Surgical Residency, followed by craniofacial fellowship at BCH. During her fellowship, she led several clinical outcomes studies analyzing long-term growth and symmetry following repair of cleft lip, under the guidance of her mentor and now colleague, Dr. John Mulliken. They continue to work closely together on research and clinical interests, including the correction of cleft nasal deformity, secondary management of craniofacial anomalies, and treatment of vascular malformations.

Following her fellowship, Dr. Ganske joined the faculty in the Department of Plastic and Oral Surgery at BCH. Her practice includes treatment of children with cleft lip/palate, microtia and prominent ears, congenital nevi, hemangioma, plagiocephaly (flat head), and facial asymmetry from congenital anomalies, paralysis, trauma, or atrophy (Parry–Romberg disease). In addition to a cleft and broad plastic surgery practice in Boston, Dr. Ganske has

initiated a partnership between BCH and the Cleft Clinic at Maine Medical Center to provide cleft care closer to home for families in Maine.

Teaching is central to Dr. Ganske's career. In her chief residency year, she won the teaching award for her dedication to educating junior

residents. She serves as BCH's Site Director for residents and students rotating in plastic surgery. Dr. Ganske enjoys lecturing in the cleft and craniofacial curriculum for Harvard and BU medical and dental schools. She is a Course Director for an innovative class at Harvard Medical School and the Museum of Fine Arts called "Training the Eye: Improving the Art of Physical Diagnosis."

Dr. Ganske's husband, Chris Looney, is a lawyer in Boston. They live in Brookline with their three daughters: twins Maeve and Charlotte, three years old, and Anna, six months.
